


#### Lise Meitner 1878 - 1968

Lise Meitner was born in Vienna and studied Physics, Mathematics and Philosophy at the University of Vienna. In 1906, she was the second woman at the university to receive a doctorate in Physics. She moved to Berlin in 1907 where she met Otto Hahn, with whom she collaborated for the



following 30 years. She was the first woman to become a full professor in Germany. Lise Meitner was Jewish; her life in Nazi Germany became increasingly at risk. She to Sweden in 1938 fled where she was able to continue her research. One of her best and most significant scientific achievements was the

theoretical explanation of nuclear fission, a work that she published with her nephew Otto Frisch in 1939. Otto Hahn was awarded the Nobel Prize in Chemistry in 1944 for the experimental component of this work. She also studied radioactivity and together with Otto Hahn discovered a number of radioactive isotopes, such as Protactinium 231. Lise Meitner was nominated for the Nobel Prize 48 times (29 in Physics and 19 in Chemistry), but none was ever awarded to her.
